
For or in connection with the construction, alteration, operation, maintenance and inspection of the following described works of improvement to be located on the above described land; for the flowage of any waters in, over, upon or through such works of improvements; and for the permanent storage and temporary detention, either or both, of any waters that are impounded, stored or detained by such works of improvement: Floodwater retarding structure No. 10, consisting of an earthen dam, emergency spillway, work site adjacent to construction area, the sediment pool, and a portion of the detention storage pool, including an area that will be inundated during emergency spillway flow, the project involving approximately 120 acres of land, as more particularly described in the plat attached hereto.









What Have I Learned?
